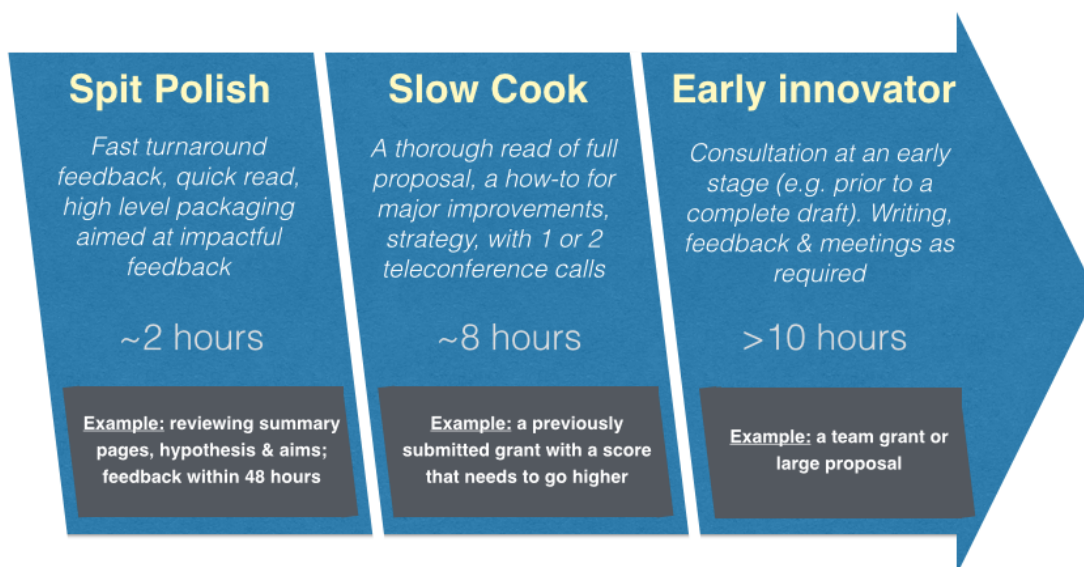


- The scientific community spends countless hours writing grants and there are more rejections than successes.
